The journey of reservations

A brief summary of important developments with respect to reservations at the central level

Year	Key development
1950 and 1951	Commencement of the Constitution and the First Amendment — enabling provisions in Articles 15 and 16 for the advancement of OBCs, SCs and STs
1982	Reservations for SCs and STs fixed at 15% and 7.5% respectively in central educational institutions and public sector undertakings
1990	The introduction of 27% reservation for OBCs in central government employment based on the recommendation of the Mandal Commission
2005	Article 15(5) inserted by the 93rd constitutional amendment that enabled reservations for OBCs, SCs and STs in educational institutions, including private ones
2019	Articles 15(6) and 16(6) inserted by the 103rd constitutional amendment which enabled up to 10% reservation for the EWS among the unreserved category in educational institutions and public employment

Women Reservation

- SC heard a petition challenging the provisions of "Nari Shakti Vandan Adhiniyam" (Constitution 106th Amendment) granting 33% reservation for women in the Lok Sabha and Assemblies.
- It mandates 33% reservation (one-third) of seats for women in the Lok Sabha, the State Legislative Assemblies, and the Legislative Assembly of the NCT of Delhi.
- Act includes horizontal reservation; applied across various categories. It ensures that women constitute a specific percentage within each group, rather than a separate, overarching category.
- Article 15(3) mandates State to take affirmative action and make special provisions for the empowerment of women.
- The 2023 law would be implemented only after the next Census and the subsequent delimitation exercise to determine seats to be reserved for women. The quota for women in the Lok Sabha and Assemblies would continue for

NIO's Storm Cycle

- Cyclonic disturbances over the North Indian Ocean including the Arabian Sea, Bay of Bengal have changed.
- Frequency of cyclonic disturbances has shifted. Arabian Sea has seen increase in activity, though its frequency remains lower than the Bay of Bengal. While number of disturbances has decreased, their severity has intensified.
- Arabian Sea disturbances are historically more likely to reach severe levels than those in the Bay of Bengal.
- Warmer oceans provide more energy, making cyclones stronger and harder to predict. The Arabian Sea is heating up more than average, leading to more intense cyclones.

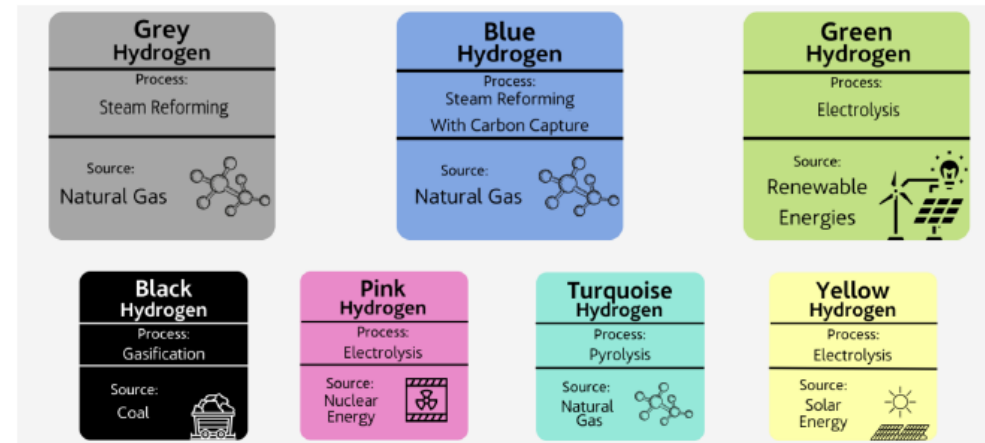
